







Wednesday—Delivery of the previous Tuesday's frozen meal plus Wednesday's hot meal, including cold components of both meals.

Friday—Delivery of the previous Thursday's frozen meal with cold components.

Weeks when Monday is a Holiday

Monday—No meal delivery during holiday week; see Wednesday below.

Tuesday—Delivery of previous Friday's frozen meal plus Tuesday's hot meal with the cold components of both meals.

Wednesday—Delivery of Wednesday's hot meal plus a frozen meal to make up for Monday's holiday meal with cold components for both meals.

Friday—Thursday's frozen meal with cold components.


The 4th of July celebration is on Friday, July 1 with a traditional picnic meal.

Often times, the recruiter is an intimate partner or family member of the victim. It is also common for traffickers to deceive their victims with false promises or job opportunities. Traffickers are known to use several forms of control over their victims including severe isolation or confinement, economic abuse, threats to harm the victim or their family, and/or physical abuse.



The Wayne County Commissioners recently gave their enthusiastic approval for a Mural Project associated with the developing park at the County Park Street Complex in Honesdale.

The youth-led project involved students from grades 6 to 11, who created a colorful and quirky, one-of-kind, 100-foot-long mural designed to grace one of the wing walls lining an old concrete train trestle that now brings pedestrians from the Walking Path at the Complex onto Park Street proper.



Stourbridge Project Maker-in-Residence Lisa Glover got the process rolling in the spring of last year when she conducted an informal survey of those using the park outside her office at the Stourbridge Project. "I'd spy them from my office roost and run down the stairs, out the door and down a small hill to hear about their dreams, wishes, and needs for the unnamed county park that they were hanging out in," she writes in her blog about the project.

During three sessions, nearly a dozen students and four leaders discussed Wayne County, practiced turning words into picture and worked together on a cohesive design.

After refining the image, Glover said, "It shows the beauty of our towns and rural areas, and it celebrates the history of those who have found a sense of freedom in Wayne County. It also shows reverence for events of local and national significance, and gives us a peek into the imaginative, creative, silly, thoughtful, minds of our young folks, who aren't afraid to ask questions like: 'What if the Central Park fountain was made of Jell-O,' or 'What if swings had wings?'"

In early May, Glover, Dave Hartung, Wallenpaupack seventh grader Sophia Yancewicz and others brought the design to the Commissioners for final approval, just in time to get the mural up and painted for a Ribbon Cutting the morning of June 18, before the Roots & Rhythm Festival began.
